



# Colorado School Finance

# Public School Funding in Colorado

- Funding level is determined by the Public School Finance Act of 1994
  amended annually by legislative action.
- The existing formula recognizes economic and demographic differences and establishes a per pupil funding level, referred to as TOTAL PROGRAM FUNDING (TPF), for each of 178 school districts.
- Total Program is the <u>maximum</u> amount a school district can receive through a combination of local tax and state assistance.
- Total Program has NOT been fully funded since 2010 through implementation of the "Budget Stabilization Factor."

## Aspen Educational Foundation (AEF)

The Aspen Education Foundation, "AEF", is a Colorado nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting the Aspen School District by raising *funds from the community*. AEF funding will be reported in a special revenue fund for the 2020-21 financial year. Revenues of \$500,000 will be budgeted for the 2020-2021 financial year.

### Aspen Public Education Fund (APEF)

The Aspen Public Education Fund, "APEF", is a Colorado nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting Aspen School District by receiving the three-tenths of one percent, .3%, sales tax approved by the electors of the City of Aspen on November 6, 2012 and disbursing these funds to the Aspen School District for educational purposes. This sales tax was approved to be collected starting January 1, 2013 and ending on December 31, 2016. The sales tax was renewed in 2016 for 5 years, through December 2021.

#### Snowmass Village Public Education Fund (SVPEF)

The Snowmass Village Public Education Fund, "SVPEF", is a Colorado nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting the Aspen School District. On November 6, 2016 the electors of the Town of Snowmass approved an annual *property tax* increase of \$510,000. The property tax increase will be used exclusively for educational purposes at the Aspen School District and will reimburse the town for the costs associated with the collection of taxes. SVPEF funding will be reported in a special revenue fund for the 2020-2021 financial year. Revenues of \$500,000 will be budgeted for the 2020-2021 financial year.
